Notice of Administrative Correction

Credit Towards Licensure for Education, Training, and Experience Received While Serving as a Member of the Armed Forces

Take notice that the Board of Marriage and Family Therapist Examiners has found a grammatical error in the text of N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.5(b)2ii.

On July 6, 2015, as published in the New Jersey Register at 47 N.J.R. 1637(a), the Board adopted N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.5. In N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.5(b)2ii, the word "to" is omitted prior to the comparison to the educational requirements described and required for licensure under N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.2. N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.5(b)2ii is administratively corrected to correct this grammatical error.

This notice of administrative corrections is published pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-2.7.

Full text of the corrected rule follows (addition indicated in boldface thus):

- 13:34-4.5 Credit towards licensure for education, training, and experience received while serving as a member of the Armed Forces
- (a) (No change.)
- (b) The Board shall issue a license to the applicant, if the applicant presents evidence to the Board that:
- 1. (No change.)
- 2. The relevant training, experience, and education the applicant has received in the military, together with any training, education, and experience obtained outside the Armed Forces, is substantially equivalent in scope and character to the training, experience, and education required for licensure under N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.2 and 4.3.
- i. (No change.)
- ii. An applicant seeking credit for education courses and/or training completed while in the military, who does not hold a master's degree in marriage and family therapy or a master's degree in social work or a graduate degree in a related field from a regionally accredited institution which provides the training and course work described in N.J.A.C. 13:34-[page=1979] 4.2, shall submit to the Board a Joint Services Transcript of his or her education/training for a determination that the education courses and/or training completed

are substantially equivalent in level, scope, and intent **to** the educational requirements described and required for licensure under N.J.A.C. 13:34-4.2. For the purpose of determining substantial equivalence of the applicant's military education and/or training, the Board shall consider only those courses relevant to the practice of marriage and family therapy that have been evaluated by the American Council on Education for substantial equivalence to civilian postsecondary curricula.
