COMPLAINT

IRWIN I. KIMMELMAN, ATTORNEY GENERAL OF NEW JERSEY, by Mary Andruzzi, Deputy Attorney General, with offices located at 1100 Raymond Boulevard, Newark, New Jersey, 07102 on the basis of information and belief by way of Complaint says:

COUNT ONE

1. Complainant, Attorney General of New Jersey, is charged with enforcing the laws of the State of New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:17A-4(h) and N.J.S.A. 45:1-14 et seq.

2. The New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners is charged with the duty and responsibility of regulating the practice of chiropractic in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:9-1 et seq., N.J.S.A. 45:9-14.5 et seq., and N.J.S.A. 45:9-41.5.

3. Respondent, Anthony A. Tangorra, D.C., 423 Passaic Avenue, Lodi, New Jersey 07644 is the holder of license No. 1395 to practice chiropractic and has been a licensee during all times pertinent hereto.

4. Respondent was charged by the United States Attorney for the district of New Jersey in Indictment No. 81-133 with mail fraud in violation of Title 18, U.S.C. Section 371 in that he conspired to fraudulently obtain money from insurance companies by preparing false medical reports and other documents.

5. On or about November 4, 1981 respondent entered into a plea of guilty to above charge (copy of Judgment of Conviction attached hereto as Exhibit A).

6. Such conviction upon a plea of guilty constitutes conviction of a crime of moral turpitude and/or a crime relating adversely to the activity regulated by the Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:9-16.

WHEREFORE, it is respectfully demanded that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of New Jersey:

1. Suspend or revoke the license of ANTHONY A. TANGORRA, D.C. to practice chiropractic,
2. Assess such penalties as may be required by law; and
3. Order such other and further relief as the Board shall deem fair and just.
