Administrative Action

CONSENT ORDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy by way of complaint and amended complaint of Deborah T. Poritz, Attorney General of New Jersey, by Marianne W. Greenwald, Deputy Attorney General alleging inter alia, that Jeffrey Taylor while employed as a supervising pharmacist in West Caldwell, New Jersey, between late 1987 and February 1994 entered fraudulent transactions into the store register and removed cash totalling in excess of \$20,000.

On July 26, 1995 respondent appeared before the Board and pled non vult to the amended complaint. Mr. Taylor represented to the Board that he has made restitution far in excess of the total monies removed and the parties being desirous of resolving this matter and the Board finding the within Order to be adequately protective of the public interest.

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS *14th* DAY OF *September* 1995,

ORDERED:

1. The license of Jeffrey Taylor, R.P., to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey is hereby suspended for two years and three months beginning September 1, 1995, and ending on November 30, 1997. The first three months of said suspension shall be active and the remaining twenty-four months shall be stayed.

2. On September 1, 1995, Jeffrey Taylor, R.P. shall pay investigative costs of \$500.00 to the Board of Pharmacy and provide documentation that restitution has been made to his former employer.

3. From September 1, 1995 through November 30, 1997, Jeffrey Taylor, R.P. shall not be permitted to be an R.P. in-charge nor hold a permit to operate a pharmacy in the State of New Jersey.

4. Jeffrey Taylor, R.P., shall complete six hundred (600) hours of community service, by November 30, 1997, the place of the community service to be determined by the Board of Pharmacy.

5. Mr. Taylor shall supply his employer (s) with a copy of this FINAL ORDER.


6. During the twenty-four months following respondent's active suspension, respondent's employer(s) shall provide a semi-annual report
