CONSENT ORDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey Board of Accountancy upon the application of Cynthia Oster for reinstatement of her license to practice accountancy which she had voluntarily surrendered by way of a Consent Order filed in January 1992 and attached hereto.

Respondent having submitted evidence of her present successful employment in an accountancy firm as well as a psychological evaluation which is supportive of reinstatement of Ms. Oster's license with specific conditions, and the Board having determined that the within Order is adequately protective of the public;

IT IS ON THIS *2nd* DAY OF *February* 1996,

ORDERED:

1. That the license of Cynthia Oster to practice accountancy in the State of New Jersey is hereby reinstated. Contemporaneously with said reinstatement, the license of respondent shall be placed on a

probationary status for eighteen (18) months from the date of entry of this Order.

2. Respondent shall comply with the following conditions during the period of probation.

a. Cynthia Oster shall continue in psychotherapy with a Board approved psychiatrist or psychologist and shall cause the Board to receive detailed reports as to her progress in psychotherapy on a six month basis.

b. Respondent shall only engage in the practice of accountancy while employed by an accounting firm licensed in the State of New Jersey and shall cause the Board to receive evaluations by her employer of her job performance on a six month basis.

c. Contemporaneously with the entry of this Order respondent shall notify the Board in writing as to her present place of employment and shall notify the Board immediately upon any change in her place of employment for the duration of the probationary period.


3. Respondent may be requested to appear before the Board for a status conference during the period of probation in the event any psychological or job performance report is unsatisfactory to the Board.
