This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Accountancy upon the receipt of information that on February 7, 1997 the Honorable Elijah L. Miller, Jr., J.S.C. found that Dong Jin Park, CPA, suffers from a mental illness and poses a danger to himself and others. The court remanded the patient to the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital in West Trenton, New Jersey. He is to remain in the high security facility until at least July 25, 1997 at which time the court will again review the matter.

Based on the aforesaid, the Board finds that Don Jin Park is incapable of discharging the functions of a licensee in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare, and that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(i) it is the decision of the New

Jersey State Board of Accountancy that the license of Don Jin Park to engage in the practice of public accountancy is hereby provisionally suspended until respondent can provide proof to the Board that he is competent to resume the practice of accountancy.

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

If respondent wishes to present information refuting any of the factual findings contained herein, such information must be presented to the Board within thirty (30) days of the entry of this Provisional Order of Suspension of License, and the Board will thereafter determine whether further proceedings are necessary. If no material discrepancies are raised through a supplemental submission during the thirty (30) day period, or if the Board is not persuaded that submitted materials merit further consideration, this Order shall become final.
