This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Psychological Examiners ("Board") on the basis of information received that on or about February 3, 1999, a Judgment of Conviction was entered in the United States District Court, Middle District of Georgia, wherein respondent entered a plea of guilty to a four (4) count indictment charging theft of government money in violation of 18 U.S.C. Section 641 and three (3) counts of false statements in violation of 18 U.S.C. Section 1001. Respondent was sentenced to three (3) years probation, including home confinement for a period not to exceed four (4) months, criminal monetary penalties in the amount of \$400.00, and restitution in the amount

of \$12,670.00 to the U.S. Treasury. The conduct underlying the conviction related to respondent's employment as a civilian psychologist for the United States Government, working at Martin Army Community Hospital, Fort Benning, Columbus, Georgia. Between January 1, 1993 and December 31, 1996, respondent stole \$12,670.44 in that he was paid by the United States Government for his services at times when he was, in fact, not at Martin Army Community Hospital, but was instead providing compensated diagnostic and treatment services for private patients in Columbus, Georgia. The respondent knowingly and willfully falsified forms by falsely declaring the hours which he certified that he worked during the pay period as a government psychologist.


The crimes for which respondent was convicted involved moral turpitude and relate adversely to the practice of psychology within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f), and the conduct which forms the basis of the conviction constitutes a failure to maintain good moral character, an ongoing requirement for licensure pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:14b-14(B); the engagement in dishonesty, fraud, and misrepresentation as well as professional misconduct, all in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b) and (e).

It appearing that the respondent desires to resolve this matter without resort to formal disciplinary proceedings and that good cause exists for the entry of the within Order,

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. The application of the respondent to practice psychology in the State of New Jersey is hereby denied.
