

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon receipt of information which the Board has reviewed and on which the following findings of fact and conclusions of law are made.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a pharmacist in the State of New Jersey and has been a licensee at all times relevant hereto.
2. On April 14, 1999 respondent was convicted of the crime of possession of controlled dangerous substances and careless driving

in Superior Court in Monmouth County. Specifically during a routine motor vehicle stop, respondent was found to be in possession of controlled dangerous substances and careless driving (Copy of Judgment of Conviction annexed hereto and made a part hereof).

3. The following sentence was ordered: 3 years probation, random urine tests, and attendance at AA/NA meetings 3 times per week.

4. A Provisional Order of Discipline was entered by the Board on July 28, 1999 and was presumed served on respondent by regular mail having not been returned to this office. Certified Mail was unclaimed and returned to this office.

5. The Provisional Order was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry unless respondent requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth in writing an and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or written evidence supporting respondent's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

6. Respondent failed to respond.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The above conviction provides grounds for the suspension of his license to practice pharmacy in New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f), in that it is based on finding or admissions that would give rise to discipline in this State and the crime of which respondent was convicted is one of moral turpitude and/or relates adversely to the practice of pharmacy.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ON THIS 16th DAY OF Sept , 1999,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey be and hereby is revoked.
