IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY	:	

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter "Board") upon the application of Allan B. Martin, M.D. to reinstate his medical license which had been voluntarily suspended on March 17, 1999 based upon alcohol abuse. Previously, on September 16, 1992, Dr. Martin's medical license was suspended. On July 14, 1993, he was granted a restricted license. The order was amended on May 1, 1995. The July 14, 1993 Consent Order provided that respondent's license would be immediately suspended upon failure to comply with the Consent Order or any evidence that respondent had ingested any alcohol or any drugs (except pursuant to lawfully authorized

prescription). On March 17, 1999, Dr. Canavan of the Physician Health Program (PHP) sent a letter to the Board notifying the Board that respondent had relapsed in his use of alcohol.

On October 6, 1999, respondent appeared before a Committee of the Board accompanied by Louis Baxter, M.D., of the PHP, to apply for reinstatement of his restricted license. Respondent requested that the Board allow him to return to the practice of medicine. Respondent testified that he had completed inpatient treatment at Seabrook House and has continued to be followed by the PHP. Respondent testified that he has been offered a position with Correctional Health Services and that the supervisor of the Correctional Health Services is aware of his past alcohol problems. Dr. Baxter appeared and offered a memorandum in support of respondent's application, and submitted documentation that respondent had undergone random urine screens for the presence of alcohol and that the results of all the tests were negative. Dr. Baxter recommended that Dr. Martin be required to take Antabuse which is effective for the treatment of alcoholism, attend not less than three documented Alcohol Anonymous meetings per week, meet monthly face-to-face with the PHP, and continue to undergo random urine screens.

The Board finding that this disposition of the matter is adequately protective of the public, and other good cause appearing;

IT IS 22nd day of October , 1999;

ORDERED that the license heretofore issued to Allan B. Martin, M.D. for the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of New

Jersey be and hereby is restored on probationary status as a restricted license pursuant to the following restrictions:

1. Dr. Martin may be employed by Correctional Health Services.

2. Dr. Martin shall undertake no other medical position or employment without prior written notice and approval of the Board.

3. Dr. Martin shall attend not less than three documented Alcohol Anonymous meetings per week and submit weekly documentation of his attendance at the meetings to the PHP.

4. Dr. Martin shall continue to cooperate with the PHP in all matters involved with his treatment and recovery, including random urine testing at least twice weekly, monthly face-to-face meetings with the PHP and ingestion of Antabuse as directed and monitored by the PHP.

5. Dr. Martin shall supply his employer with a copy of this Order.

6. Dr. Martin shall authorize and cause said employer and PHP to notify the Board of any information concerning relapse or any other professional misconduct within 48 hours of receipt of such information.

7. Any failure by Dr. Martin to comply with any part of this Order, or any evidence that Dr. Martin has ingested any alcohol or any drugs (except pursuant to a lawfully authorized medical prescription), shall result in the immediate suspension of


his license, and verification of such a failure to comply or of the ingestion of alcohol or drugs may result in the permanent revocation of that license.


