CONSENT ORDER
SURRENDERING LICENSURE

TO PRACTICE RESPIRATORY CARE
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was presented to the New Jersey State Board of Respiratory Care based upon information received that Mr. Krauszer had engaged in one week of inpatient treatment at Carrier Clinic including treatment for alcohol and drug dependency following his arrest after a motor vehicle accident at which time he was observed with an IV needle in his wrist, and 2 ampules of Diprivan, a prescription legend drug which is a sedative, in his automobile. Mr. Krauszer acknowledging that he is unable to practice respiratory care at this time, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(i), and

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being desirous of avoiding further formal proceedings herein; the Board having determined that the within disposition is adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare; and the parties have agreed to the surrender of Mr. Krauszer's license to practice respiratory care in the State of New Jersey, without prejudice to a petition for reinstatement in the future; and for other good cause shown,

IT IS ON THIS ^{5th} DAY OF ^{October} SEPTEMBER, 1999,

ORDERED THAT:

1. The surrender of license by Richard Krauszer, R.T. is accepted effective NUNC PRO TUNC August 21, 1999. An application for reinstatement of license will not be considered until such time as Mr. Krauszer demonstrates via reports and random urine and/or blood monitoring that he has maintained sobriety for a minimum of no less than three (3) months, has successfully completed inpatient and outpatient intensive treatment, has forwarded reports and discharge summaries of all such treatment to the Board, along with a detailed report from his psychotherapist who recommends re-entry into practice. After receipt of such documentation, the Board will consider an application for reinstatement on such conditions as the Board deems appropriate, after an appearance before the Board by Mr. Krauszer at which the burden shall be upon him to demonstrate he is fit and competent to resume the practice of respiratory care. Any application will be considered in good faith by the Board.

2. Respondent Richard Krauszer shall return his original New Jersey license and current biennial registration to the Office of the New Jersey State Board of Respiratory Care, 124 Halsey Street, 6th Floor, Newark, New Jersey 07101 within ten (10) days of the entry of this Order.

3. The parties stipulate and agree that the entry of this Order shall not be deemed an admission by Respondent, but is without prejudice to any further action by the Board regarding facts or circumstances not mentioned in this Order or any action by other law enforcement authorities.
