This matter was opened to the New Jersey Board of Accountancy by receipt of information that respondent has held himself out to the public as an accountant in the State of New Jersey without being currently licensed, in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:2B(e) and (g). To wit, respondent has not renewed his license since October 1, 1995, he has failed to return records to complainant Kenneth Alswang in a timely manner and he has continued to hold himself out as a certified public accountant despite his failure to renew his license. Respondent, admitting to the aforementioned conduct, and the parties having agreed and consented to the resolution of this matter without the necessity of the Board seeking injunctive relief, fines and costs in the Superior Court of New Jersey, and respondent understanding the terms and impact of the within Order,

IT IS ON THIS 14th DAY OF January , 2000,

ORDERED AND AGREED:

1. Respondent shall cease and desist holding himself out to the public as a certified public accountant, a public accountant or as an accountant licensed in the State of New Jersey. He shall not use any stationery, rubber stamps, business cards, taped messages or other representations indicating he is an accountant licensed in New Jersey, nor shall he continue to advertise as a firm of accountants or list himself or his firm as certified public accountants, public accountants or tax and/or management accountants. He shall take affirmative steps to remove advertisements from all directories and provide the Board with written proof of that action.

2. Respondent shall pay costs of the investigation in this matter to the State Board of Accountancy upon submission of an Affidavit of Costs from the Board's Executive Director.

3. Respondent specifically agrees and acknowledges that upon any further violation of this Order, the Superior Court of the State of New Jersey may after a summary hearing enter an Order restraining respondent from such violations upon the affidavit of

the Attorney General and without notice to respondent.
