

Since that time, there have been no adverse actions taken against his license in that State. Additionally, respondent has provided proof to the Board that he has completed more than 500 hours of continuing education in the last 4 years.

Following review of the entire record developed in connection with respondent's application for reinstatement, the Board finds that respondent has demonstrated sufficient rehabilitation and sufficient competency to practice to persuade the Board that his return to practice with restrictions is consistent with the public interest and that good cause exists for entry of this Order :

THEREFORE, IT IS ON THIS 19th DAY OF January _____ 2000

ORDERED:

1. The license of Jack Martin Gelb, D.D.S. to practice dentistry in the State of New Jersey shall be reinstated effective on the entry date of the this Order.


2. Random and unannounced audits not less than twice a year of respondent's patient records and billing records shall be conducted by the Board or its designee ,at the expense of respondent. On demand made, respondent shall immediately make available all records necessary to conduct the audit as determined by the Board or its designees. The cost of each such audit shall be based on the standard hourly rate for the Board's investigators prevailing at the time of the audit and shall be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the respondent's receipt of a statement of such costs from the Executive Director of the Board setting forth the hourly rate and the total hours of the audit.

3. Respondent shall pay costs of \$126 which reflects costs of the Board's review of application, including the respondents appearance before the Board in August 1998 in connection with his application for relicensure.

4. Respondent shall not seek modification of the terms of this order for a period of two years from its entry.
