ORDER


This matter was reopened before the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners (the "Board") upon the Board's receipt of a petition from David I. Canavan, M.D., Medical Director Emeritus, Physicians' Health Program and Respondent's counsel on behalf of Respondent Libico Mario DiBlasio, M.D., seeking change in the Board's licensing status from Inactive to Active. By way of background, Respondent voluntarily agreed to cease and desist from practicing medicine in the State of New Jersey pursuant to a Consent Order of Voluntary Cessation of Practice on June 26, 2000, pending resolution of a hearing regarding his summary suspension from practice in the State of New York. Subsequent to entry of said Order, the New York case was dismissed on January 26, 2001 and no

appeal was taken. The Consent Order required that, in the event respondent were to petition the Board for reinstatement of licensure, he would need to provide the Board with evidence that his license to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in New York is without limitations. Further, at the discretion of the Board, he would appear before the Board or a Committee of the Board, to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that he is capable of discharging the functions of a licensee in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare.

The Board has reviewed New York's determination and order dated January 26, 2001 in which New York completely dismissed the charges. The Board thus concludes that cause exists at this time to enter an Order vacating its consent order of voluntary cessation of practice dated June 26, 2000. The Board being further satisfied that the within Order adequately protects the public health, safety and welfare, and that good cause exists for entry of the within Order.

The status of the license of Respondent Libico Mario DiBlasio, M.D. to practice medicine in the State of New Jersey is hereby changed from Inactive to Active, thereby vacating its June 26, 2000 consent order of voluntary cessation.
