**CONSENT ORDER**

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Accountancy upon receipt of information that on January 20, 2001 respondent was convicted in Superior court in Union County, New Jersey of the crime of endangering the welfare of a child, and was sentenced to a three (3) year term of probation, 100 hours of community service, and a fine of \$2,500.

Respondent appeared before a committee of the full Board on May 8, 2001 and testified under oath in response to board

members' questions. Mr. Sosinski attested to the underlying facts in the matter and further, to his remorse that the incident had occurred. He has voluntarily refrained from engaging in the practice of accountancy since August of 1999, but remains current with his license and continuing education. Respondent is forever barred from holding a position in any law enforcement agency.

The Board, having considered respondent's testimony, has determined the following disciplinary action to be adequately protective of the public, and it further appearing that respondent wishes to resolve this matter without the necessity of further proceedings, and for good cause shown,


**ORDERED AND AGREED:**

1. The license to practice accountancy of James Sosinski shall be, and hereby is, suspended for the duration of the period of criminal probation, January 20, 2004. All of said suspension shall be stayed subject to the following condition.



Respondent shall ensure the submission of quarterly reports from a Board approved psychiatrist or psychologist for no less than one year from the entry of this Order, whose reports shall substantiate that respondent has been participating in psychotherapeutic counseling no less than one time per week. Should any report indicate a need for continued therapy, respondent

shall continue to participate and ensure the submission of quarterly reports to the Board.
