ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon application of Joseph DeMarinis, Jr. for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey. On July 26, 2000 by order of the Board of Pharmacy, respondent's license to practice pharmacy was revoked with no right to request reinstatement prior to the termination of his criminal

probation. Respondent has testified under oath before the Board on September 26, 2001 as to his remorse for his past conduct and has produced an order modifying the criminal probation to conclude in July of 2001. The Board has determined to reinstate respondent's license subject to certain restrictions and conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 24<sup>th</sup> DAY OF October, 2001,

**ORDERED AND AGREED:**


That the license of Joseph DeMarinis, Jr. to practice pharmacy in this State shall be reinstated upon proof of respondent's successful completion of 30 continuing education credits and proof of completion of the 250 hours of community service required by the Order Modifying the Judgment of Conviction filed in U.S. District Court of New Jersey in January of 2001.

That upon reinstatement the respondent's license shall be subject to the following limitations until further Order of the Board:

1. Respondent shall not act as the pharmacist-in-charge at any pharmacy and shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy;
2. Respondent shall be barred from dealing with Medicare/Medicaid patients including, but not limited to, any dispensing, consulting or billing activity.
3. Respondent shall present a copy of this Order to any future employer prior to commencing work as a licensee and shall

ensure that his employer or health care provider notifies the Board in writing that he or she has received and understands the terms of the Order.
