: **ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT**
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This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon application of John Maiorano for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey. On March 24, 2000 by order of the Board of Pharmacy, respondent's license to practice pharmacy was revoked with no right to request reinstatement prior to the termination of his criminal probation resulting from his conviction of the crime of conspiracy to defraud

the United States. Respondent testified under oath before the Board on October 9, 2002 as to his remorse for his past conduct and has produced proof that the criminal probation is terminated. The Board has determined to reinstate respondent's license subject to certain restrictions and conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE on this 8th day of January, 2003,

ORDERED:

1. That the license of John Maiorano to practice pharmacy in this State shall be reinstated upon proof of respondent's successful completion of 30 continuing education credits.

2. That upon reinstatement the respondent's license shall be subject to the following limitations until further Order of the Board:


a. Respondent shall not act as the pharmacist-in-charge at any pharmacy and shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy.

b. Respondent shall be barred from dealing with any program administered in whole or in part by the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, and all Federal health care programs as defined in the Social Security Act, which shall include, any dispensing, consulting, billing activity related to recipients of such programs or management of a pharmacy that participates in any of the above mentioned programs.

c. Respondent shall present a copy of this Order to any future employer prior to commencing work as a licensee and shall ensure that each employer notifies the Board in writing that he or she has received and understands the terms of the within Order.
