Administrative Action

FINAL ORDER
OF DISCIPLINE

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors upon receipt of information which the Board has reviewed and on which the following findings of fact and conclusions of law are made;

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent, Stephen Flack Fink, P.E., License No. GE 28867, is an engineer licensed in the State of New Jersey.
2. The Respondent failed to submit a biennial renewal application to renew his license to practice engineering in the State of New Jersey, which was due on or before May 31, 2002.
3. The Respondent submitted an Application for Reinstatement dated May 1, 2003. In Respondent's application, he admitted that

he practiced engineering without a license while his license was lapsed.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Respondent's practice of engineering since June 1, 2002 constitutes the unlicensed practice of engineering in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:8-27 and N.J.S.A. 45:8-39.

DISCUSSION ON FINALIZATION

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, a Provisional Order of Discipline ("POD") was entered by this Board on June 9, 2003 and served by regular and certified mail upon Respondent. The POD was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry unless Respondent requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth in writing any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting Respondent's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

Respondent responded with payment of the penalty of \$500.00 on or about July 2, 2003. Therefore, the Board has determined that further proceedings are unnecessary and that there is a sufficient basis to take disciplinary action against Respondent's license

based on his admissions that he practiced engineering in the State of New Jersey without a license.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 21 day of JULY, 2003,

ORDERED that:

1. Respondent shall be, and hereby is, reprimanded.
2. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$500.00, which the Board acknowledges was paid on or about July 2, 2003.
