



The Board finds sufficient evidence of respondent's rehabilitation of his gambling addiction which he contends led to his act of embezzlement, and as such, finds the conviction shall not be considered an impediment to current licensure, provided he satisfies the following requirements.

IT IS THEREFORE on this 24<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2003,

ORDERED that:

1. Respondent shall present acceptable documentation of his successful completion of 30 current continuing education credits acceptable to the Board and documentation of restitution as ordered by the Court.

2. Respondent shall submit documentation to the Board of his successful completion of the New Jersey Pharmacy Law Exam.

3. Respondent shall complete a practicum of 500 hours under the supervision of a Board approved preceptor, keep an intern log and shall submit documentation acceptable to the Board from the preceptor evaluating his performance in the practice of pharmacy.

4. At such time that respondent satisfactorily completes the requirements of paragraphs one through three herein, respondent's license shall be reinstated.

5. Immediately following reinstatement, respondent shall be placed on probation for five (5) years during which period respondent shall not be permitted to act as R.P. in charge.

6. Respondent shall not be permitted to hold a permit, nor an interest in a permit, to operate a pharmacy in the State of New Jersey permanently.
