

This matter was first brought to the attention of the Board voluntarily by respondent on March 6, 2003. On August 7, 2003 respondent pled guilty to a one count Information in United States District Court in the District of Massachusetts charging respondent with violations of Title 21 U.S.C. § 333, § 353 and Title 18 U.S.C. § 2. Specifically, while employed as a retail staff pharmacist in New Jersey, from her home respondent purchased Insulin, a prescription drug, for a permit holder other than her employer, which drug such having been purchased from a staff member of her previous employer at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center ("BIOMC") in Massachusetts at the federally permitted favorable

cost, and thereafter, sold the Insulin to such retail permit holder, other than her employer. Respondent received from such permit holder an amount equaling her cost for the Insulin that she paid the BIOMC staff member.

Respondent acknowledges the above described conviction, and further acknowledges that the conviction constitutes a crime that relates adversely to the profession of pharmacy; and respondent being desirous of resolving this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings; and all parties having agreed to the terms and entry of the within Order, and for good cause shown,

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 22ND day of October , 2003,

ORDERED:

1. That the license of Grace Dube, R.P., to practice pharmacy shall be revoked. The Board shall not entertain an application for reinstatement until such time as respondent demonstrates completion of the criminal term of supervised release or probation. However, the Board does take note that Mrs. Dube surrendered her license through counsel on March 11, 2003.

2. Respondent shall not engage in the practice of pharmacy in the State of New Jersey or in any other state in any manner or form, including but not limited to the following: she shall not be present in the prescription area of any pharmacy; she shall not handle, order, inventory, compound, count, fill, refill

or dispense and drug; she shall not engage in the acceptance of any prescription in person or by telephone; she shall not advise or consult with any person concerning the properties and actions of drugs; she shall not handle or dispense prescriptions; she shall not type labels for prescriptions or enter information on profile cards.

3. Respondent shall by execution of the within Order surrender her most recent renewal card of her license to an authorized representative of the Board.

4. Upon such time as Respondent is eligible to apply for appearance before the Board pursuant to this Order, respondent shall demonstrate that she has satisfied the conditions of her supervised release or probation and that she otherwise meets the qualifications for license.
