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This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon receipt of information that respondent, having pled guilty to one count of Medicaid Fraud in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County, has entered into a Consent Agreement with the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services to pay restitution in the amount of one hundred and eighty thousand five hundred and fifteen dollars and seventy cents (\$180,515.70)



or dispense any drug; he shall not engage in the acceptance of any prescription in person or by telephone; he shall not advise or consult with any person concerning the properties and actions of drugs; he shall not handle or dispense prescriptions; he shall not type labels for prescriptions or enter information on profile cards.

3. Respondent shall contemporaneously with execution of the within Order surrender his original wall certificate, and the most recent renewal card of his license to an authorized representative of the Board.

4. Manuprasad Parikh shall divest any and all ownership interest in Irving Pharmacy, currently located at 382 Main Street, Paterson, NJ 07501, and transfer any and all interest in said pharmacy to a bona fide purchaser, approved by the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy and not related to respondent by consanguinity or marriage, nor to a business entity in which any such related individual has a financial interest. Within three (3) months of the entry of this Order, respondent may apply to the Board for a three month extension of the divestiture requirement demonstrating good cause why the extension should be granted. If a Board approved transfer of ownership does not occur within six months from the entry of this Order, the permit to operate Irving Pharmacy shall be surrendered to the Board

office and the pharmacy closed pursuant to the appropriate procedures.

5. Respondent shall have no contact with Toledo Drugs, currently located at 3808 Bergenline Ave., Union City, NJ 07087, except to the extent necessary to collect income from the same. MANUPRASAD PARIKH shall be permitted to remain a minority owner of Toledo Drugs, but is absolutely barred from the property, and is barred from giving any advice, guidance or instruction concerning the operation and/or management of Toledo Drugs until the term of probation is successfully completed and full restitution according to the terms of the related civil consent judgment is made except upon consent of the State;

6. Respondent shall have no contact with Williams Pharmacy, currently located at 305 Broadway, Paterson, NJ 07501, except to the extent necessary to collect income from the same. MANUPRASAD PARIKH shall be permitted to remain a minority owner of Williams Pharmacy, but is absolutely barred from the property, and is barred from giving any advice, guidance or instruction concerning the operation and/or management of Williams Pharmacy until the term of probation is successfully completed and full restitution according to the terms of the related civil consent judgment is made except upon consent of the State;

7. Should the respondent violate any of the terms of

the within Order, the Board may on short notice, hold proceedings to actively suspend the permits of Irving Pharmacy, Toledo Drugs and Williams Pharmacy.
