This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon application of Kenneth Enemuio for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey. On December 17, 1997 by order of the Board of Pharmacy, respondent's license to practice pharmacy was revoked. (Attached hereto and made a part of this Order.) Respondent has submitted voluminous

documents attesting to his cooperation with the United States Attorney's Office in further prosecutions, his fulfillment of all criminal obligations, and his good moral conduct since the criminal disposition. Having reviewed the submission, the Board has determined to reinstate respondent's license subject to certain restrictions and conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 26th DAY OF DECEMBER, 2003,

ORDERED AND AGREED:

1. The license of Kenneth Enemuo to practice pharmacy in this State shall be reinstated upon proof of respondent's successful completion of 75 continuing education credits, and the Law Exam administered by the Board, and approval by the Board of the successful completion of a 500 hour practicum under the immediate supervision of a Board approved preceptor. A detailed written evaluation satisfactory to the Board shall be submitted by the preceptor.

2. That upon reinstatement the respondent's license shall be subject to the following limitations until further Order of the Board:

a. Respondent shall not act as the pharmacist-in-charge at any pharmacy and shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy.

b. Respondent shall be barred from dealing with Medicare/Medicaid patients or patients in any federally and/or

state funded programs including, but not limited to, any dispensing, consulting or billing activity.

3. Respondent shall present a copy of this Order to any future employer including his preceptor prior to commencing work as a technician and/or licensee and shall ensure that his preceptor and his employer notify the Board in writing that they have received and understand the terms of this Order prior to respondent commencing his practicum and for his work as a licensee.
