This matter was most recently opened to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners ("Board") upon the petition of Frantz Jasmin, M.D. for reinstatement of his New Jersey medical license and for an unrestricted license. The Board's records reflect that on or about March 6, 2001, a Corrected Final Order of Discipline was filed, which suspended Dr. Jasmin's license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of New Jersey for two (2) years or until such time as he was able to demonstrate that he fully complied with the terms of the Order from the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, filed January 27, 2000. The New York Board Order suspended Dr. Jasmin's license to practice in New.

York for two (2) years, with the last twenty-one (21) months of that suspension stayed and served as a period of probation. Dr. Jasmin was also required to perform 200 hours of community service. The New York Order was entered after Dr. Jasmin plead guilty to Mail Fraud on July 16, 1998.

On September 25, 2002, Dr. Jasmin appeared, *pro se*, before a Preliminary Evaluation Committee of the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners and testified in support of his petition for reinstatement of licensure. Dr. Jasmin testified at length with regard to his current practice in New York and the improvements that he has made with regard to patient record keeping and billing. He testified that he has completed his 200 hours of community service, as required by the New York Order, and that his period of probation in New York ended on February 27, 2002. Dr. Jasmin testified that he has complied with all the terms of his previous Orders in both New York and New Jersey. In addition, Dr. Jasmin recently submitted proof to the Board that in February 2004, he completed thirty-one (31) hours of Category I CMEs in Internal Medicine.

The Board is satisfied that Dr. Jasmin has complied with all of the terms of both the New Jersey and New York Board Orders, as well as all of the requirements imposed upon him following his guilty plea in the criminal matter.

The Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare,

IT IS on this 15th day of May 2004

ORDERED:

1. The **license** of Frantz Jasmin, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey is hereby reinstated without restrictions.
