This matter was opened to the State Board of Medical Examiners ("Board") upon the filing of an Order to Show Cause and Verified Complaint on June 30, 2004, with a return date scheduled for July 14, 2004, seeking the temporary suspension of the medical license of Respondent, Paul S. Sender, M.D. The Verified Complaint alleges that Respondent engaged in repeated acts of gross negligence and incompetence and that his continued practice of medicine constitutes a clear and imminent danger to

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the public. Respondent and the Board entered into an additional Consent Order, dated July 9, 2004, adjourning the return date of the Order to Show Cause until the August 11, 2004 Board meeting or until another agreed upon date. During that time period, Respondent voluntarily agreed to refrain from practicing medicine and surgery.

Respondent now consents to voluntarily surrender his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey without prejudice and in accordance with the terms of this Order. The Board finding the within disposition to be adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, IT IS, therefore, on this 27th day of July, 2004,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent Paul S. Sender, M.D. shall voluntarily surrender his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey, commencing upon his signing of this Order, pending completion of the full plenary hearing resolving the Administrative Verified Complaint in this matter;

2. This matter will be transferred to the Office of Administrative Law for a full plenary hearing upon execution of the within Order and upon the Board's receipt of Respondent's

Answer to the Verified Complaint, which shall be filed no later than August 16, 2004;

3. Respondent shall return his original New Jersey license and current biennial registration to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners, Post Office Box 183, Trenton, New Jersey 08625-0183, upon his receipt of a filed copy of this Order;

4. Respondent shall return his original CDS registration to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners, Post Office Box 183, Trenton, New Jersey 08625-0183, upon his receipt of a filed copy of this Order;

5. Respondent shall immediately advise the DEA of this Order;

6. During the pendency of this matter, Respondent, at his own option, shall submit to an evaluation by a Board-approved focused evaluation program, and undertake the successful completion of any follow-up remediation required by such evaluation program, with further review of such assessment and/or remediation by the Attorney General and either the Educational Director or the Medical Director of the Board. The focused evaluation program and any subsequent follow-up remediation would be at Respondent's expense;

7. Respondent is hereby granted leave to petition for the right to resume practice, with restrictions approved by the Board, in the event that he undertakes and completes the actions in Paragraph 6 of this Order. Said resumption of practice shall be within the sole discretion of the Board and shall not be deemed a settlement of the allegations of the Administrative Verified Complaint. A hearing on Respondent's application to resume the practice of medicine shall be heard by the Board, or a Committee thereof, within forty-five (45) days or sooner of the date of application;

8. Respondent shall be permitted to continue solely in an administrative capacity at his office, located at 185 Cedar Lane, Teaneck, New Jersey, and shall not direct the form or substance of any medical service provided to any patient treated by any other physician at that office;

9. The within voluntary surrender of licensure by Respondent is entered into without admission of any wrongdoing on the part of Respondent and without prejudice to the further investigation and prosecution of this matter by the Attorney General of the State of New Jersey; and


10. The terms of this Order shall remain in effect pending final disposition of the Administrative Verified Complaint or

subsequent modification of the Order by the Board upon application by Respondent or the Attorney General.


