


This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Respiratory Care ("the Board") after it received information that a Judgment of Conviction was filed against respondent Maynor Rosario on or about April 27, 2004. Respondent was convicted in Superior Court of New Jersey, Law Division, Criminal Part, Sussex County upon a plea of Guilty to Third Degree Crime of Conspiracy and Third Degree Crime of Theft by Deception regarding an incident which occurred between May 1, 2000 and September 7, 2000. Respondent engaged in a conspiracy whereupon his vehicle would be taken by two other individuals for the purpose of reporting it stolen and defrauding respondent's insurance company. The Court imposed, inter alia, the following conditions for probation: respondent must serve one hundred and eighty (180) hours of

service and restitution, until such time as Maynor Rosario's criminal probation is terminated. Respondent shall notify the Board when the term of the criminal probation is terminated, and respondent shall appear before the Board, if so requested by the Board; and it is further

ORDERED that, in view of respondent's satisfying his obligation to Sussex County Probation Services for one thousand one hundred and fifty dollars and sixty-five cents (\$1,150.65), no further monetary penalty shall be assessed by the Board; and it is further

ORDERED that, during the period of probation and continuing thereafter, respondent shall obey all of the laws of the State of New Jersey, the United States and their political subdivisions as well as all regulations, rules or laws governing the practice of respiratory care in this State, including that he notify the Board in writing of any change of address within ten (10) days of such change; and it is further

ORDERED that, respondent's failure to comply with any provision of this Order and/or any deviation from the terms of this order without the prior written consent of the Board shall constitute a violation of probation. Upon receipt of any reliable information indicating that respondent has failed to comply or deviated from the terms of this Order without the prior written consent of the Board or otherwise violated any term of this Order, the Board may institute such further proceedings as are appropriate.


