This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy on application by respondent for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in New Jersey. On December 2, 1997 by Order of the Board, respondent's license was revoked based upon respondent's conviction in the District of Maryland, United States District Court, of Conspiracy to Commit an Offense Against the United States and of Making a False Statement to a Federal Agency, aiding and abetting. Respondent was given a custodial sentence for 27 months and thereafter placed on probation for three years.

The Board has reviewed respondent's application as well as all supporting documents submitted by counsel for respondent. The

Board finds the conviction shall not be considered an impediment to current licensure, provided respondent satisfies the following requirements.

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 8th DAY OF September 2004,

ORDERED THAT:

1. At such time that the Board determines respondent has satisfactorily completed the requirements of paragraphs two through four herein, respondent's license shall be reinstated.

2. Respondent shall present documentation acceptable to the Board of his successful completion of 75 current continuing education credits acceptable to the Board.

3. Respondent shall submit documentation acceptable to the Board of his successful passage of the New Jersey Pharmacy Law Exam.

4. Respondent shall complete a practicum of 1000 hours as an intern under the immediate personal supervision of a Board approved preceptor, keep an intern log and shall submit documentation acceptable to the Board from the preceptor evaluating his performance in the practice of pharmacy.

5. Upon reinstatement, respondent's license shall be subject to the following limitations and conditions:

a) Respondent shall not be permitted to act as pharmacist-in-charge in any pharmacy;

b) Respondent shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy;

c) Respondent shall not engage in any operation of a pharmacy, including but not limited to, advertising and/or marketing, purchasing or ordering, managing or conducting any business with insurers or third party payors on behalf of a pharmacy on or off the permitted premises; and

d) Respondent shall present a copy of this Order to any employer prior to commencing work as a licensee and shall ensure that his employer notifies the Board in writing that he or she has received and understands the terms of the Order.
