

Re: Offer of Settlement In Lieu of Filing a Formal Disciplinary Complaint

Dear Ms. Eckhardt:

This letter is to advise you that the New Jersey State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners (the "Board") has had an opportunity to review information concerning your reinstatement of license to practice physical therapy in the state of New Jersey that was received on or about December 1, 2004. Specifically, the information reviewed included the reinstatement application that indicated that the last renewal was due January 31, 2004 or within thirty (30) days of this date. You acknowledge by affidavit that you continued to work from February 30, 2004 through December 1, 2004 as a physical therapist at Susan Slater Physical Therapy located at 200 Mountain Avenue, Bound Brook, New Jersey during the period that your license was suspended pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b).

Upon review of all available information, the Board has preliminarily found that probable cause exists to support a finding that you violated N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b) and (c) in that you failed to renew your license within thirty days of the January 31, 2004 renewal period and you continued to practice with a suspended license after February 29, 2004 which action is deemed to be the unlicensed practice of physical therapy.

At this juncture, the Board has preliminarily concluded that the above violations are sufficient to warrant the initiation of formal disciplinary proceedings against you. Notwithstanding that decision, however, the Board has determined that it will first offer you an opportunity to settle this matter, and thereby avoid the initiation of disciplinary proceedings, should you consent to:

1. Cease and desist in the future from continuing to practice physical therapy without a valid current license.
2. Pay a penalty in the amount of \$1000.00 for continuing to practice physical therapy while your license was suspended. (to be paid immediately upon your signing of the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter by sending a certified check or money order payable to the Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, P.O. Box 45012, Newark, New Jersey 07101 to attention of Susan Gartland, Executive Director.).

If you are willing to settle this matter on the offered settlement terms, you may do so by signing the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter, and returning it to the Board office. Upon your signature, this letter will be a matter of public record.

In the event you are unwilling to settle this matter on the offered terms, it will be referred to the Attorney General's office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement action. In such event, you will be afforded an opportunity to defend against the alleged violations. If an evidentiary hearing is deemed warranted the Board will either conduct that hearing at a date and time to be scheduled or refer the matter to the Office of Administrative Law. You are advised, however, that in the event formal charges are filed, the Board may assess civil penalties in an amount greater than that herein offered in settlement should any charges against you be sustained. Additionally, the Board may, if the facts are found to so warrant, enter an order, requiring you to reimburse certain monies and/or requiring you to pay costs incurred by the Board. If you elect to settle this matter presently, you should sign the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter and return it to the Board within fifteen (15) days following your receipt of this letter. In the event that the Board receives no response from you within fifteen (15) days, the Board's settlement offer will be withdrawn, and the matter will be referred to the Attorney General's Office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement proceedings.
