(a) not to stock or dispense any controlled substances in his office(s) during the probationary period,

(b) to submit to random unannounced inspections for five (5) years, and

(c) to adhere to specified treatment recommendations.

Having reviewed the entire record, including the documents provided by the South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, South Carolina Board of Dentistry (S.C. Board of Dentistry Consent Order dated February 7, 2003, S.C. Board of Dentistry Amended Formal Accusation dated September 4, 2002, and S.C. DHEC Consent Agreement and Order dated August 5, 2002), it appears to the Board that respondent has had his authority to engage in the practice of dentistry suspended, with the suspension stayed and respondent placed on probationary status by the South Carolina Board of Dentistry.

These facts establish the basis for disciplinary action against respondent's license pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(g) in that respondent's license to practice dentistry has been suspended by South Carolina for reasons consistent with other provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21. In addition, it appears to the Board that respondent's admissions, including admitting to having obtained controlled substances by fraudulent means, publishing an advertisement implying a specialty in pediatric dentistry and having violated South Carolina statutory and regulatory provisions, constitute professional and occupational misconduct pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(e) and crimes or offenses which relate adversely to the activity regulated by the Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f). It appearing that respondent desires to resolve this matter without recourse to formal proceedings and for good cause shown;

IT IS ON THIS 22<sup>nd</sup> DAY OF February, 2005

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. Respondent's license to practice dentistry in the State of New Jersey is hereby suspended for a period of five (5) years retroactive to the effective date of the South Carolina Consent Order. Respondent's suspension shall be stayed and respondent's license shall continue

uninterrupted in a probationary status for a minimum of five (5) years from the effective date of the South Carolina Consent Order of February 7, 2003, provided that respondent fully complies with the terms and conditions imposed by the South Carolina Consent Order.

2. In the event that the Board receives reliable information that respondent failed to fulfill any requirement of the South Carolina Consent Order, the suspension provided herein shall automatically become active and shall continue until further order of the Board after respondent provides proof that he has complied with all of the provisions of the South Carolina Consent Order. Additionally, the stayed suspension shall be activated should respondent engage in any violations of the Board's statutes or regulations during the stayed suspension period.


3. Respondent shall cease and desist from violating the statute and regulations governing the practice of dentistry in the State of New Jersey. Subsequent violations will subject respondent to enhanced penalties pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-25.
