

Queens County. Specifically, respondent was convicted of 18 counts of the criminal sale of a controlled substance a fourth degree crime, and one count of Grand Larceny, a third degree crime.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The above judgment provides grounds for the suspension of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f) in that the conviction is one of moral turpitude and/or reflects adversely on the practice of pharmacy.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 23rd day of February, 2005,

ORDERED that:

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey be and hereby is revoked.

2. The within Order shall be subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry hereof unless respondent requests a modification or dismissal of the above stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of law by:

(a) Submitting a written request for modification or dismissal to, Joanne Boyer, Executive Director, State Board of Pharmacy, 124 Halsey Street, Sixth Floor, Newark, New Jersey 07101.

(b) Setting forth in writing any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed.

(c) Submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting respondent's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

3. Any submissions will be reviewed by the Board, and the Board will thereafter determine whether further proceedings are necessary. If no material discrepancies are raised through the submission by respondent during the thirty-day period, or if the Board is not persuaded that submitted materials merit further consideration or mitigation of the penalties set forth herein, a Final Order of Discipline will be entered.

4. In the event that respondent's submissions establish a need for further proceedings, including, but not limited to, an evidentiary hearing, respondent shall be notified with regard thereto. In the event that an evidentiary hearing is ordered, the preliminary findings of fact and conclusions of law contained herein shall serve as notice of the factual and legal allegations in such proceeding. However, the Board shall not be limited to the sanctions herein and may recoup costs to the State.
