

cards, taped messages or other representations indicating he is an accountant licensed in New Jersey, nor shall he advertise as a licensed certified or registered accountant or list himself as a certified public accountant, accountant, or auditor unless he obtains a valid license pursuant to the "Accountancy Act of 1997" (N.J.S.A. 45:2B-42 et seq.), nor shall any firm in which he has any interest do any of the above unless it holds a valid registration pursuant to the "Accountancy Act of 1997" (N.J.S.A. 45:2B-42 et seq.). He shall take affirmative steps to remove such designations from all directories and provide the Board with written proof of that action.

2. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty of \$10,000 to the State Board of Accountancy in this matter; and shall pay one-half of the costs of the investigation in this matter upon receipt of an Affidavit of Costs from the Executive Director of the Board.



Respondent specifically agrees and acknowledges that upon proof of a violation of this Order after a summary hearing before the Superior Court of the State of New Jersey an Order may be entered enjoining respondent from such violations, assessing penalties, and ordering costs for the use of the State.
