CONSENT ORDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon the receipt of information that respondent, having pled guilty to one count of Medicaid Fraud in violation of N.J.S.A. 30:4D-17(c) in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Monmouth County, has entered into a Consent Agreement with the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services to pay restitution and fines in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).

Respondent wishing to resolve formal proceedings before the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy, having waived any right to

a hearing in this matter and the Board having considered the factual basis of the plea and the substance of the Consent Agreement and for good cause shown,

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS *12th* DAY OF *June*, 2005,

ORDERED and AGREED:

1. Respondent shall immediately surrender to the Board of Pharmacy his New Jersey license to practice pharmacy, to be deemed a revocation with no right to reinstatement prior to the termination of criminal probation or supervised release.

2. Respondent shall not engage in the practice of Pharmacy in the State of New Jersey for one year from the date of entry of this Order, including but not limited to the following: he shall not be present in the prescription area of any pharmacy; he shall not engage in the acceptance of any prescription in person or by telephone; he shall not advise or consult with any person concerning the properties and actions of drugs; he shall not handle or dispense prescriptions; he shall not type labels for prescriptions or enter information on profile cards.

3. Respondent shall contemporaneously with the execution of the within Order surrender his most recent renewal card of his license to an authorized representative of the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy.

4. Respondent shall not be a permit holder nor related by consanguinity or marriage to a permit holder, nor to a business

entity in which any such related individual has a financial interest in a pharmacy in this State. Further, respondent shall not manage a pharmacy or participate in the billing and collecting activity for any pharmacy in this State.
