



terminated due to a violation of Virtua's substance/alcohol abuse policies by testing positive for alcohol. Respondent was identified as in violation of those policies on December of 2004 and was referred to an employee assistance program. Upon completion of the agreed rehabilitation program, she returned to work under an agreement with her employer which included random breath testing. On April 7, 2005 she was found to be in violation of that agreement by again testing positive to wit, a Breathalyzer test showed a blood alcohol level of 1.11, above the legal limit, and thus, was terminated.

The Board believing that the within resolution is adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and respondent waiving any right to hearing and desirous of resolving this matter prior to the filing of a formal administrative complaint, has agreed to surrender her license immediately pursuant to the following conditions.

**IT IS THEREFORE** on this 19<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2005,

**ORDERED AND AGREED**, that the license of Denise C. Gonschery, R.P. to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey is hereby suspended pending further order of the Board;

**ORDERED AND AGREED**, pending further order of the Board, respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in the practice of pharmacy, including the following: respondent shall not handle,

order, inventory, compound, count, fill, refill or dispense any drug; shall not handle anything requiring a prescription including devices and medications; she shall not handle prescriptions; she shall not advise or consult with any patient, and she is prohibited from being present within a prescription filling area of any pharmacy, and it is further

**ORDERED AND AGREED**, pending further order of the Board that respondent shall by execution of the within Order surrender her original wall certificate, her wallet certificate, and her most recent renewal card of her license to an authorized representative of the Board, and it is further

**ORDERED AND AGREED**, respondent may appear before the Board to seek reinstatement and the burden shall be on respondent to demonstrate that she is fit and competent to resume the practice of pharmacy in order to be reinstated and to be placed on probationary status for no less than one year, subject to conditions to be determined by the Board, and it is further

**ORDERED AND AGREED**, that prior to the scheduling of an appearance seeking reinstatement of license, respondent shall submit documentation satisfactory to the Board inclusive of, but not limited, to weekly, random, witnessed urine screens, complete treatment records of any diagnostic and rehabilitative therapy

and an in-depth, current evaluation from a Board approved psychiatrist or psychologist.
