



It appears that respondent has successfully completed her one year term of probation, and has satisfied the court as to fines and restitution. However, respondent continues to be barred by the Department of Human Services from participation in any manner with any health care program that receives federal or state funding. Respondent being desirous of resolving this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings; and all parties having agreed to the terms and entry of the within Order, and for good cause shown,

**IT IS THEREFORE** on this *9<sup>th</sup>* day of *August*, 2005,

**ORDERED:**

1. That the license of Jennifer Kim, R.P., to practice pharmacy shall be reinstated after she submits documentation to the Board demonstrating successful completion of 30 continuing education credits, 10 of which shall be didactic, and has completed a criminal background check which has been received, reviewed and deemed as satisfactory by the Board.

2. Respondent shall not serve as pharmacist in charge, nor be a permit-holder in any manner, to operate a pharmacy in this State.

3. Respondent shall serve a copy of this Order on any employer prior to commencing work as a licensee and shall ensure that each employer sends documentation to the Board that he or she has reviewed the complete Order.

4. Respondent may petition the Board to modify paragraphs 2 and 3 when, and if, she is permitted by the Department of Human Services to participate in health care programs receiving federal or State funding.
