Re: Offer of Settlement In Lieu of Filing a Formal Disciplinary Complaint

Dear Dr. Lee:

This letter is to advise you that the New Jersey State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (the "Board") has had an opportunity to review information concerning your use of the "allergy elimination technique." It appears from that review that you have acknowledged advertising and using NAET in your practice as a means to eliminate allergies in your patients.

At this juncture, the Board has preliminarily concluded that probable cause exists to support a finding that you violated N.J.S.A. 45:9-14.5 and N.J.A.C. 13:44E-1.1 by offering a service which is beyond the permissible scope of chiropractic practice in this State.

The above violation is sufficient to warrant the initiation of formal disciplinary proceedings against you. Notwithstanding that decision, however, the Board has determined that it will first offer you an opportunity to settle this matter, and thereby avoid the initiation of formal disciplinary proceedings, should you consent to:

1. cease and desist from the use of NAET as a technique for the diagnosis and elimination of allergies in your patients, and from advertising the availability of NAET in your practice.


If you are willing to settle this matter on the offered settlement terms, you may do so by signing the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter, and returning it to the Board office at the address set forth above. Upon your signature, this letter will be a matter of public record.

In the event you are unwilling to settle this matter on the offered terms, it will be referred to the Attorney General's office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement action. In such event, you will be afforded an opportunity to defend against the alleged violations. If an evidentiary hearing is deemed warranted, the Board will either conduct that hearing at a date and time to be scheduled or refer the matter to the Office of Administrative Law. You are advised, however, that in the event formal charges are filed, the Board may assess civil monetary penalties against you should any charges against you be sustained. Additionally, the Board may, if the facts are found to so warrant, enter an order requiring you to pay the additional costs incurred by the Board.



In the event that the Board receives no response from you within fifteen (15) days, the Board's settlement offer will be withdrawn, and the matter will be referred to the Attorney General's Office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement proceedings.
