ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon application of David Samuels for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey. On January 31, 2000 by order of the Board of Pharmacy, respondent's license to practice pharmacy was revoked with no right to reapply prior to his completion of a criminal term of probation. Respondent had unlawfully purchased medication samples for sale to the public from a pharmaceutical salesperson.

Respondent has submitted documents attesting to his fulfillment of all criminal obligations, and his good conduct since the criminal disposition. Having reviewed his submissions, and being satisfied that respondent has demonstrated sufficient remorse

and rehabilitation and that the within Order is sufficiently protective of the health, safety and welfare of the public, the Board has determined to reinstate respondent's license subject to certain restrictions and conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 25<sup>th</sup> DAY OF *April* 2007,

**ORDERED AND AGREED:**

1. The license of David Samuels to practice pharmacy in this State shall be reinstated upon proof of respondent's successful completion of the following:
  - a. successful completion of the Pharmacist Self-Assessment Mechanism;
  - b. successful completion of 75 continuing education credits in those areas shown to be problematic for respondent in the Self-Assessment, all of which shall not be counted in the 30 credits needed for the next renewal;
  - c. a five hundred hour practicum with a satisfactory evaluation from a Board-approved preceptor;
  - d. payment of all required fees.
2. That upon reinstatement the respondent's license shall be subject to the following limitations for one (1) year from the date of reinstatement:
  - a. respondent shall not act as the pharmacist-in-charge at any pharmacy or as a preceptor and,
  - b. respondent shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy.
3. Respondent, who is currently disqualified from any participation in any federal or State funded insurance program,

shall provide a complete copy of the Order to his employer prior to accepting a position as a pharmacist or as an intern. Moreover, he shall insure that the employer notifies the Board in writing that he or she has read the terms of the Order.

4. Respondent may request modification of this Order, should his disqualification from participation in federal or state insurance programs be terminated.
