



been misbranded and adulterated, from an individual in Union County, New Jersey. On September 28, 2004 respondent was sentenced and placed on probation for a term of three (3) years and ordered to pay a fine of \$10,000.00.

The above conviction provide grounds for the suspension of respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f) in that the crime of which respondent was convicted was one of moral turpitude and/or related adversely to the practice of pharmacy. On January 25, 2006 by way of Consent Order respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey was revoked. Respondent was permitted to request reinstatement no earlier than the conclusion of the three (3) year period of probation imposed by the U.S. District Court, District of New Jersey.

Respondent has now made reapplication for the reinstatement of his pharmacy license. He appeared before the Board on July 11, 2007 with Mahesh Rajan, Esq., and testified under oath in response to Board member inquiries. Respondent has paid all restitution and fines, and that he has completed probation as well as the required continuing education credits for renewal. Respondent has expressed his remorse for his unlawful conduct and now wishes to resolve this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings. The Board finds the within Order sufficiently

protective of the public health, safety and welfare and for good cause shown;

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 30<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2007,

**ORDERED AND AGREED:**

1. Respondent shall submit proof to the Executive director of the Board of his satisfactory completion of 60 continuing education credits required for renewal, 20 of which must be live and six of which must be in pharmacy law. All applicable fees for renewals, reinstatement and a criminal history shall be paid by respondent.

2. After satisfying the terms of paragraph 1, respondent's license will be reinstated and placed on probation for three years from the date of entry of this Order subject to the following conditions:

a. During the probationary period, respondent shall not be a preceptor, an R.P. in-charge or a permit holder.

b. respondent shall provide a copy of this Order to all prospective employers who participate in any State and/or federally funded insurance program. Prior to commencing any employment, respondent shall ensure that each employer submits to the Board written confirmation that he or she has read the terms of the Order and is aware that respondent is currently debarred from participation in any State and/or federally funded insurance program in any manner. This provision shall be enforceable for the

probationary period or until respondent is no longer debarred, whichever is longer.

c. Respondent shall comply with all statutes, regulations, and professional standards applicable to the practice of pharmacy.
