ORDER REINSTATING LICENSE

This matter was reopened before the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners (the "Board") upon the Board's receipt of a petition from respondent Neal R. Glass, M.D., requesting that the Board consider reinstating respondent's New Jersey medical license. By way of background, Dr. Glass's New Jersey license was suspended for a period of three years upon the entry of a Final Order of Discipline filed on June 29, 2001. The entirety of the suspension was stayed, and Dr. Glass was instead placed on probation for a three year period. The Order further provided that, prior to resuming any practice in New Jersey, Dr. Glass was to be required to appear before the Board or a Board Committee and then demonstrate fitness to practice and compliance with all conditions and terms of the Ohio Board.

The New Jersey action was based on findings of fact that the Ohio State Board of Medical Examiners suspended respondent's license to practice in Ohio for an indefinite period of time, a minimum of thirty days of which was to be served actively and the remainder to be stayed and served as a period of probation (the period of probation was to be imposed for a period of not less than three years), effective April 26, 1999. The Ohio action was based on findings that respondent prescribed Schedule III, IV and V controlled substances to a specified

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patient without maintaining any medical records concerning his care and/or prescribing. Respondent's Ohio license was reinstated (subject to probationary terms) on or about June 9, 1999, upon the Ohio Board's entry of an Amended Order, and thereafter, on or about April 13, 2005, Dr. Glass was released from the terms and conditions of probation established by the Ohio Board's June 9, 1999 Amended Order. Dr. Glass does, however, remain subject to a permanent limitation and restriction in the State of Ohio requiring that he refrain from self-treating and from treating any family member, except in the event of life-threatening emergency.

Dr. Glass appeared before a Preliminary Evaluation Committee of the Board on April 25, 2007, and then testified, among other items, concerning the action taken against him in the State of Ohio, the efforts he undertook to satisfy probation requirements placed upon him by the Ohio Medical Board, and regarding his present activities. Upon consideration of available evidence and respondent's testimony, the Board finds that respondent completed all requirements of probation imposed on his practice in Ohio and that respondent's medical license in the State of Ohio was fully restored in April 2005, subject only to the permanent limitation on self-treating and treating family members.

The Board being presently satisfied, based on the findings set forth above, that good cause presently exists to reinstate Dr. Glass' license to practice medicine in the State of New Jersey, subject to imposition of a restriction similar to that placed by the Ohio Board that he not engage in any self-treating or treating any family members, except in an emergent life-threatening situation, and being further satisfied that the entry of the within Order is in the public interest,

IT IS on this 1st day of May, 2008

ORDERED:

1. The license of respondent Neal R. Glass, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey is hereby reinstated.

2. Dr. Glass shall refrain from self-treating and from treating any family member, except in the event of a life-threatening emergency.

3. Dr. Glass shall hereafter ensure that he complies with all statutes and regulations applicable to the practice of medicine in the State of New Jersey.
