




I am aware that, by signing this acknowledgment, I am waiving any rights I may have to defend myself against any charges of wrongdoing at an administrative hearing. I am also aware that the action taken against me by the Board herein is a matter of public record and that this letter is a public document. I hereby agree to a formal reprimand, immediate payment of a civil penalty of \$3,000.00 and investigative costs of \$125.00. I further agree to refrain from providing professional engineering services in connection with the design and implementation of septic systems and comply with all other terms and conditions should I seek removal of thus restriction as outlined herein above.

Offer of Settlement In Lieu of Filing a Formal Disciplinary Complaint

Dear Mr. Truran:

This letter is to advise you that the New Jersey State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors (hereinafter the "Board") has had an opportunity to review information concerning your professional conduct in connection with a complaint filed by the complainant, Wendy J. Tillmann. More specifically, the complainant alleges that the septic system which you designed immediately prior to her purchase of a home in Sparta, New Jersey never worked properly.

Upon review of all available information, the Board has preliminarily found that probable cause exists to support a finding that you are in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(e) for professional misconduct in that you failed to properly take into consideration a field condition in connection with the design of the septic system, which contributed to its failure.

As a result of the foregoing, the Board has preliminarily determined that the above violations are sufficient to warrant the initiation of formal proceedings against you. Notwithstanding that decision, the Board has determined that it will first offer you an opportunity to settle this matter in an attempt to avoid the initiation of more formal proceedings if you consent to the following terms:

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1. Agree to a formal reprimand upon your signing of the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter in connection with the above violation;

2. Payment of a civil penalty totaling **\$3,000.00** to be paid **immediately** upon your signing of the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter in connection with the above violation;

3. Payment of investigative costs in the amount of **\$125.00** to be paid **immediately** upon your signing of the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter in connection with the above violation; and

4. Agree to refrain from providing professional engineering services in connection with the design and implementation of septic systems. In the event you seek to remove this restriction, and prior to any professional services being rendered, you must appear before the Board or committee thereof to: (1) demonstrate that you are fit to practice engineering in the area of septic systems; and (2) provide proof of successful completion, to the Board's satisfaction, of two (2) courses pre-approved by the Board in the area of septic system design, to be completed within three (3) months of your appearance before the Board.

In making a determination, you should know that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-25 any person who engages in conduct which is in violation of any provision of the statutes and regulations administered by the Board shall, in addition to any other sanctions provided by statute, be liable for a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000.00 for the first violation and not more than \$20,000.00 for the second and each subsequent violation. However, in an effort to resolve this matter amicably, the Board offers to settle on the terms stated above. If you are willing to resolve this matter on the offered settlement terms, you may do so by signing the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter and returning it to the Board office within 15 days. In such event, this letter shall be a matter of public record.

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In the event you are unwilling to settle this matter on the offered terms, it will be referred to the Attorney General's office for the initiation of formal proceedings. In such event, you will be afforded an opportunity to defend against the alleged violations. You are advised, however, that in the event formal charges are filed, you may be assessed civil penalties in an amount greater than that herein offered in settlement should any charges against you be sustained. Additionally, the Board may, if the facts herein or any additional facts are found to so warrant, enter an order requiring you to reimburse certain monies and/or requiring you to pay costs incurred by the Board. If you elect to settle this matter, you should sign the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter and return it to the Board within fifteen (15) days following your receipt of this letter. In the event that the Board receives no response from you within fifteen (15) days, the Board's settlement offer shall be considered withdrawn and the matter will be referred to the Attorney General's Office for the initiation of formal proceedings.
