



August 2001 through June 2004 for services that were not provided. Respondent was sentenced to three years probation, to pay restitution of \$1585.82 to Ameritas Life Insurance Company, and penalties. As part of the his sentence, respondent's license to practice dentistry was suspended for a period of one year. Pursuant to the administrative consent order, respondent paid civil penalties of \$17,000.

Having reviewed the information provided, it appears to the Board that these facts establish basis for disciplinary action pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f) as respondent has been convicted of a crime of moral turpitude and relating adversely to the activity regulated by the board, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(h), for failing to comply with Board regulations related to submission of insurance claims, and pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(k) as respondent has been subject to an order in an administrative proceeding that imposed civil penalties pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 et seq. It appearing that respondent desires to resolve this matter without recourse to formal proceedings and for good cause shown:

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 2008,

CONSENTED AND ORDERED that:

1. The license of Gary Osmanoff, D.D.S., to practice dentistry is suspended for a period of three years, 364 days of which shall be an active suspension and the remainder stayed and served as a period of probation. The suspension, including the active period, shall be deemed to have commenced on the date respondent surrendered his license pursuant to his sentence in the criminal proceedings. Should respondent violate any law or regulation administered by the Board during the period of

suspension, the Board may, in addition to any other sanction it deems appropriate, activate the stayed period of suspension.

2. Respondent is hereby reprimanded for his conduct that resulted in his conviction and administrative sanction by the Office of the Insurance Fraud Prosecutor.

3. Prior to his return to the active practice of dentistry, respondent shall fully attend, successfully complete, and pass an ethics course within six (6) months of entry of a final order in this matter. Respondent shall complete the ProBE (Professional Problem Based Ethics) course offered by The Ethics Group, 89 Summit Avenue, Suite 185, Summit, New Jersey 07901, the PRIME (Professional Renewal in Medicine through Ethics) course offered by the Center for Continuing Education in the Health Professions at UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, 97 Paterson Street, Room 124, New Brunswick, New Jersey 08903, or another course of similar content and length pre-approved by the Board. Documentation of full attendance and successful completion of the course shall be provided to the Board.


4. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,500 for violation of a law or regulation administered by the Board. The \$2,500 penalty shall be submitted by certified check or money order made payable to the State of New Jersey and shall be sent to Jonathan Eisenmenger, Executive Director, State Board of Dentistry, 124 Halsey Street,


