This matter was opened before the Professional Counselor Examiners Committee of the New Jersey State Board of Marriage and Family Therapy Examiners (hereinafter "the Committee"), upon receipt of a letter from respondent, dated May 30, 2008 stating that he had engaged in a sexual relationship with a client and grossly mismanaged the client's treatment

Respondent at this time has agreed voluntarily to the revocation of his license to practice as a professional counselor in the State of New Jersey in accordance with the terms of this Consent Order. The Committee finds the terms of this Consent Order to be adequately

protective of the public interest and respondent, without any admissions, waiving any right to a hearing, desiring to resolve this matter without further proceedings and having agreed to the entry of this order;

IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 11th DAY OF September, 2008
ORDERED:

1. Respondent shall immediately surrender his license to practice professional counseling in the State of New Jersey to be deemed a revocation precluding respondent from applying for a reinstatement of his license for a minimum of five (5) years. Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from such practice until further order of the Committee. Respondent shall deliver his 2006-2008 biennial renewal certificate (expiration date November 30, 2008), his original wall certificate, certification and wallet size credential forthwith to Ms. Elaine DeMars, Executive Director of the Professional Counselor Examiners Committee, P.O. 45044, 124 Halsey Street, Newark, New Jersey 07101, contemporaneously with the signing of the within Consent Order.

2. Respondent shall not engage in any professional counseling practice and/or mental health counseling, including uncompensated or volunteer counseling, or counseling in an exempt setting, or life coaching, unless and until the Committee issues a subsequent Order permitting him to engage in the practice of professional counseling. No credit shall be granted toward the time prior to any application for reinstatement for any period in which respondent is practicing any type of counseling in any other jurisdiction or country, whether or not such counseling is provided in an exempt setting.

3. Five (5) years after the filing of the within Consent Order, respondent may apply for reinstatement of his license to engage in

professional counseling. In that event, respondent shall submit the following documentation:

a. Transcript from a graduate program in professional counseling demonstrating that he attended in-person (not a distance learning and/or internet program) and successfully completed a three credit graduate course pre-approved by the Committee in the area of professional counselor ethics and boundaries.

b. Documentation that respondent has successfully passed the Certified Clinical Mental Health Counselor Credential Examination.

c. A statement signed and dated by the respondent listing each job respondent engaged in during the time respondent's license was revoked, including name of business or entity, address, name of supervisor, telephone number of supervisor, dates of employment and description of respondent's duties. If the event respondent was self-employed, respondent shall provide a copy of the IRS 1099 and/or IRS Schedule C that he filed each year during the period of revocation.

d. Documentation of compliance with terms of the Consent Order.

e. Copies of current evaluation of treatment and reports from every mental health professional who has treated respondent from May 30, 2008 until any application for reinstatement of license. All such reports must recommend that respondent can safely practice professional counseling.

f. If requested by the Committee, respondent shall appear before the Committee, at which time the burden shall be on respondent to demonstrate that he has complied with all the terms of the


Consent Order and is fit and competent to engage in the practice of professional counseling, and is able to assure the Committee that the conduct leading to entry of this order will not recur.
