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: SUMMARY ORDER
: OF SUSPENSION

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry ("Board") upon receipt and review of the following information:

1. Mary Jane Gagliano Kasliner, R.D.H. ("respondent"), was initially licensed to practice dental hygiene in this State on May 1, 1986.
2. Respondent did not renew her license to practice dental hygiene prior to its expiration on December 31, 2003, and has not renewed or attempted to renew her license since that time.
3. In July 2002, respondent appeared before the Board to answer questions concerning allegations that she had submitted false information to her employer regarding completion of continuing education as required to maintain current licensure. She denied

any wrongdoing. In October 2005, respondent advised the Board that she has retired from the practice of dental hygiene.

4. Respondent's failure to renew her license for the biennial registration period beginning January 1, 2004 and at any time since then, resulted in a lapsed license status and provides grounds to automatically suspend respondent's license to practice dental hygiene in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b).

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 15th day of October, 2008,


ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's license to practice dental hygiene in the State of New Jersey shall be, and hereby is, suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1, without a hearing. Any practice of dental hygiene during the period in which she does not hold an active license shall be deemed the unlicensed practice of dental hygiene and shall subject respondent to disciplinary action.

2. In the event that respondent seeks reinstatement of her New Jersey license, she shall appear before the Board or a committee of the Board: to establish that she is fit to practice dental hygiene in this State and to address the allegations that she falsified information to her employer. The Board reserves the right to deny reinstatement, take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon respondent's license to practice dental hygiene in the State of New Jersey.
