This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") upon receipt of respondent Abdul-Hameed Anayoor's ("respondent") application for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in this State. By Consent Order filed on June 23, 2005, respondent voluntarily surrendered his New Jersey license based upon respondent's plea of guilty to one count of Medicaid Fraud in violation of N.J.S.A. 30:4D-17(c). Respondent agreed that there would be no right to seek reinstatement of his license until the termination of criminal probation or supervised release. Respondent has now made application for the reinstatement of his pharmacy license.

In support of his application, respondent testified before the Board concerning his conviction and subsequent release from probation on October 23, 2006.

He also testified that he was prohibited from participating in Medicaid and Medicare programs for a period of time as a result of his conviction.

Respondent, being desirous of resolving this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings, and agreeing to waive any right to same, and the Board having determined that this Order is sufficiently protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and all parties agreeing to the terms of this Order;

**IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 19th DAY OF DECEMBER, 2008,
ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:**

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey is hereby reinstated subject to the conditions set forth in this Order.
2. Respondent shall pay all reinstatement fees and submit proof of the necessary continuing education credits prior to his license being reinstated.
3. Respondent shall not act as a preceptor or a pharmacist-in-charge (RPIC) at any pharmacy, or be the owner of any pharmacy for the later of one (1) year from January 15, 2008 or until successful compliance with the terms set forth in paragraph 4 herein.
4. Respondent shall successfully complete and pass the ProBE (Professional Problem Based Ethics) course offered by The Center for Personalized Education for Physicians (CPEP), 7351 Lowry Boulevard, Suite 100, Denver, Colorado, 80230. Upon Board review and approval of the ProBE course evaluations, respondent may petition the Board for removal of the restrictions set forth in paragraph 3 of this Order.
5. Respondent shall serve a copy of this Order on all employers, licensee supervisors, and/or responsible entities or officials at each and every facility where he plans to practice pharmacy, prior to commencing work as a licensee and shall ensure that

~~each employer and licensee supervisor~~ sends documentation to the Board that he or she has reviewed the complete Order. This provision shall apply until respondent is removed from the OIG debarment list.
