**CONSENT ORDER**

TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AND SURGERY  
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

---

This matter involving Keith P. Radbill, D.O. ("Dr. Radbill") was opened to the State Board of Medical Examiners ("Board") upon receipt of information concerning Dr. Radbill's compliance with his enrollment in the Alternate Resolution Program ("A.R.P.") of the Professional Assistance Program ("P.A.P."), and specifically with terms of enrollment agreed to by Dr. Radbill on June 17, 2003 and modified on September 18, 2006.

Although Dr. Radbill had been permitted to participate in the A.R.P. and have his identity protected, he has been reported by name to the Board as a result of his recent non-compliance with the terms of his monitoring program.

**CERTIFIED TRUE COPY**

Pursuant to his agreement with the A.R.P., Dr. Radbill was required to remain abstinent from all psychoactive substances. On four occasions in October and November 2008, urine samples collected from Dr. Radbill tested positive for the presence of Tramadol, for which Dr. Radbill did not have a bona fide prescription. Under oath before the Impairment Review Committee ("I.R.C.") of the Board, Dr. Radbill testified that he had used professional samples to self-medicate. The A.R.P. and I.R.C. are satisfied that Dr. Radbill suffers from a documented medical condition which is now being managed by his personal physician. Nonetheless, the act of self-medicating was violative of Dr. Radbill's agreement with the A.R.P.

In order to avoid further formal proceedings, Dr. Radbill consents and agrees to each and every term of this Consent Order. The Board has determined that the within disposition is adequate to protect the public health, safety and welfare. For such reasons and other good cause shown,

ORDERED:

1. Keith P. Radbill, D.O., shall be enrolled in the Professional Assistance Program ("P.A.P.").
2. The terms of Dr. Radbill's previous enrollment in A.R.P. shall be carried forward into his enrollment in P.A.P. with modifications as follows:

- a. Dr. Radbill shall maintain absolute abstinence from all psychoactive substances, including alcohol, unless prescribed by a treating physician for a documented medical condition with notification from his treating physician to the P.A.P. of the diagnosis and prescribed medications.
  - b. Dr. Radbill shall be subject to random, twice-weekly urine monitoring for the duration of his enrollment in P.A.P., unless modified by subsequent order of the Board in consultation with P.A.P.
  - c. Dr. Radbill shall be required to attend ninety (90) meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous and/or Narcotics Anonymous within a ninety (90) day period. Attendance shall be verified by P.A.P.
  - d. Dr. Radbill shall meet in-person with a clinical representative of P.A.P. at a frequency consistent with the duration of his enrollment in P.A.P. Dr. Radbill shall be allowed to continue to be treated and monitored by his current P.A.P. representative.
  - e. Status reports from the P.A.P. shall be made to the Board and the I.R.C. on a regular basis with immediate notification of any evidence whatsoever of non-compliance or relapse.
3. Dr. Radbill shall continue to comply with all other recommendations set forth by P.A.P. Dr. Radbill shall

continue to remain solely responsible for all costs associated with his enrollment in, and compliance with, P.A.P.

4. The Board and the Attorney General shall continue to have complete access to the results of any evaluation or testing that Dr. Radbill may undergo as the result of his participation in P.A.P. The Board and the Attorney General may continue to communicate directly with P.A.P. regarding Dr. Radbill's participation in P.A.P., and the Board and the Attorney General may continue to specifically request and receive information regarding Dr. Radbill's compliance with any recommendation of P.A.P.
5.
  - a. Dr. Radbill shall fully disclose in a timely manner to P.A.P. the names and practice identification information of any physicians or other healthcare professionals for which he seeks treatment, and the conditions for which treatment is being sought.
  - b. Dr. Radbill shall fully disclose in a timely manner the circumstances and terms of his participation in P.A.P., including but not limited to the terms of this Consent Order, to all such physicians or healthcare professionals.
  - c. Dr. Radbill shall ensure that all such treating physicians or healthcare professionals provide

confirmation to P.A.P. of their receipt of the terms of Dr. Radbill's participation in P.A.P.


6. Dr. Radbill shall be limited to engaging in the practice of medicine for a maximum of twenty (20) hours per calendar week, unless modified by subsequent order of the Board. Dr. Radbill shall advise all employers of this restriction, without prejudice to any other disclosures required as a condition of employment.
7. Any violation of this Consent Order by Dr. Radbill will result in disciplinary actions by the Board, including suspension or revocation of Dr. Radbill's license and such other sanctions as the Board deems appropriate.
