This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon receipt of information that respondent pleaded guilty to one count of recklessly committing Health Care Claims Fraud in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:21-4.3, in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Bergen County. On or about October 3, 2008 respondent was sentenced to one year of criminal probation.

The above conviction provides grounds for the revocation or suspension of respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f) in that the crime of which respondent was convicted is one of moral turpitude and relates adversely to the practice of pharmacy

The parties, having agreed to the resolution of this matter without further formal proceedings, and respondent having agreed and given her voluntary consent to the within Order and waiving any right to a hearing in this matter, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

**IT IS THEREFORE ON THIS 15th DAY OF JUNE , 2009,
ORDERED AND AGREED:**

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy is hereby suspended for two (2) years, retroactive to and effective October 3, 2008, granting respondent credit for a period of time she has voluntarily refrained from practice. The first eighteen (18) months shall be served as a period of active suspension. The remaining six (6) months, beginning on April 3, 2010, shall be stayed and served as a period of probation provided that Respondent provides proof to the Board's satisfaction that she has successfully completed all requirements outlined in this Order and that she has complied with all application requirements including a Criminal History Background Check and payment of all

reinstatement fees.

2. During the period of her active suspension, Respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in the practice of pharmacy including the following: respondent shall not handle, order inventory, compound, count, fill, refill or dispense any drug; she shall not handle anything requiring a prescription including devices and medications; she shall not handle prescriptions; she shall not advise or consult with patients, and she is prohibited from being present within a prescription filling area of a pharmacy.

3. Respondent shall take and successfully complete, at her own expense, either the ProBe or Prime ethics course. Successful completion means that all sessions were attended, all assignments were properly and appropriately completed, and a passing grade was achieved which was unconditional and without reservation. Respondent shall submit to the Board documentation of the successful completion of said course prior to April 3, 2010.

4. Respondent shall take and successfully complete 30 continuing education credits as described in N.J.A.C. 13:39-3A.1 et. seq. Respondent shall submit to the Board documentation of the successful completion of said continuing education credits prior to April 3, 2010.

5. Respondent shall submit proof to the Board's satisfaction that she has successfully completed all requirements outlined in

this Order and that she has complied with all application requirements including a Criminal History Background Check and payment of all reinstatement fees. Upon submission of these proofs, but in no event earlier than April 3, 2010, the remaining period of Respondent's suspension shall be stayed and served as a period of probation.

6. Within five days of receipt of a filed copy of this Order, Respondent shall surrender her original wall certificate, her wallet certificate, and the most recent renewal card of her license to an authorized representative of the Board or mail these items to: Executive Director Joanne Boyer, New Jersey Board of Pharmacy, P.O. Box 45013, Newark, New Jersey 07101.
