**SUMMARY ORDER  
OF  
SUSPENSION**

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") upon receipt of information that Charles Jyamfi, R.P. ("Respondent") was indicted on July 27, 2007 in Superior Court of new Jersey, County of Essex for first-degree racketeering conspiracy, first degree racketeering, second degree conspiracy, first degree money laundering, second degree fencing and receiving stolen property in connection with Ojah Pharmacy in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:41-1, N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, N.J.S.A. 2C:41-2c, N.J.S.A. 2C:41-2d, N.J.S.A. 2C:5-2, N.J.S.A. 2C:20-2b(4), N.J.S.A. 2C:20-7 et seq., N.J.S.A. 2C:21-25 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 2C:21-27. Respondent was the owner and Registered Pharmacist in Charge of Ojah Pharmacy, located at

42-44 Sussex Avenue, East Orange, New Jersey, at the time of his alleged crimes. On September 12, 2007, a bench warrant was issued for Respondent's arrest by the Superior Court of New Jersey, County of Essex.

Respondent's failure to submit his biennial renewal in New Jersey in 2009 has resulted in a lapsed certificate status and the automatic suspension of Respondent's certificate to practice as a pharmacist in the State of New Jersey without a hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b).

**IT IS THEREFORE** on this 9<sup>th</sup> day of SEPTEMBER, 2009,

**ORDERED**

1. Respondent's certificate to practice as a pharmacist in the State of New Jersey is suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b), without a hearing.
2. Respondent shall refrain from engaging in practice as a pharmacist until such time as his license is reinstated and until further order of the Board. Any practice in this State prior to such reinstatement and Board Order shall constitute the unlicensed practice of pharmacy.
3. In the event that Respondent seeks reinstatement of his New Jersey license at any time in the future, then Respondent shall be required to appear before the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy to establish that he is fit to practice as a pharmacist in New Jersey and to provide information regarding the conduct surrounding his criminal indictment for first-degree racketeering, money laundering and theft.
4. The Board reserves the right to take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon Respondent's certificate to practice as a pharmacist in the State of New Jersey.
