TO PRACTICE CHIROPRACTIC
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Chiropractic Examiners upon receipt of information which the Board has reviewed and the parties wishing to resolve this matter without further formal proceedings, hereby stipulate to the following facts and conclusion of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent, William James, D.C., is a chiropractic physician in the State of New Jersey and has been a licensee at all times relevant hereto.
2. Respondent's New Jersey biennial license # 38MC00230600 expired on August 31, 2001.
3. Notwithstanding the expiration of his biennial license, Respondent continued to practice chiropractic in New Jersey for the succeeding eight (8) years without renewal, which by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(c), rendered his actions the unlicensed practice of chiropractic.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The aforesaid conduct provides grounds for the Board to order Respondent to cease and desist from the unlicensed practice of chiropractic in New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:1-22(c), in that Respondent's continued practice of chiropractic in New Jersey notwithstanding his failure to renew his license violates N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(c).

2. The aforesaid conduct provides grounds for the Board to impose disciplinary action pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:1-21(h) and to order Respondent to pay a civil monetary penalty pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:1-22(b) and N.J.S.A. 45:1-25, in that Respondent's continued practice of chiropractic in New Jersey notwithstanding his failure to renew his license violated N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(c).

3. The aforesaid conduct provides grounds for the Board to order Respondent to take and pass an examination to determine whether he can practice with reasonable skill and safety as a condition of reinstatement of his license to practice chiropractic in New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:1-22(g) and N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(d), in that Respondent has not practiced lawfully in New Jersey for more than 5 years.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 7th day of December, 2009

ORDERED AND AGREED that:

1. Respondent shall cease and desist from the practice of chiropractic in New Jersey until and unless his license to practice chiropractic is formally reinstated by the Board;

2. Respondent is hereby assessed a civil penalty, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-22, in the amount of \$8,000.00. Payment shall be by certified check or money order made payable to the State of New Jersey, and shall be sent to: Jonathan Eisenmenger, Executive Director, Board of Chiropractic Examiners at 124 Halsey Street, Sixth Floor, P.O. Box 45004, Newark, New Jersey

07101, no later than thirty (30) days from the entry of this Consent Order. Subsequent violations will subject Respondent to enhanced penalties pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-25.

3. As a precondition for the reinstatement of his license to practice chiropractic in New Jersey, Respondent shall take and pass the Special Purposes Examination for Chiropractic (SPEC), given by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners and shall pay all past delinquent renewal fees and a reinstatement fee, as required by N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.2.


4. Respondent shall pay costs of investigation in the amount of \$136.83, which shall be paid within thirty (30) days of signing this Order. Payment shall be sent to Jonathan Eisenmenger in the manner and at the address described in paragraph #2 of this order.

5. Any practice in this State prior to formal reinstatement of license by the Board shall constitute grounds for a separate disciplinary action for the unlicensed practice of chiropractic.


6. Failure to comply with any provisions of this Order or remit any and all payments required by this Order will also result in the filing of a certificate of debt and may result in subsequent disciplinary proceedings for failure to comply with an Order of the Board.
