This matter was most recently opened to the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") upon receipt of a request from George Stillwill, R.P., to have his license to practice pharmacy reinstated. Board records reveal that on or about December 7, 1999, Mr. Stillwill pled guilty to one count of using a communication facility (telephone) facilitating the knowing and intentional distribution of Oxycodone and Hydrocodone, Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substances, in violation of 21 USC 841(a). Mr. Stillwill was sentenced to a period of incarceration for four years and thereafter, one

year of probation. Mr. Stillwill surrendered his license on an interim basis by way of a Consent Order filed with the Board on February 4, 1999. Mr. Stillwill's license was then revoked by way of Consent Order filed with the Board on May 1, 2001.

Mr. Stillwill appeared and testified before the Board on December 10, 2008 in support of his petition for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy. He acknowledged that he diverted a total of 1160 tablets of Oxycodone and Hydrocodone on two occasions from the pharmacy where he was then employed in order to pay a sports betting debt that he had incurred to a bookmaker. According to Mr. Stillwill's testimony, the bookmaker had threatened bodily harm if payment was not rendered. Mr. Stillwill served 37 months of incarceration, and provided a copy of a letter from the United States District Court, District of New Jersey, Probation Office, stating that he completed his one year term of supervised release on June 3, 2005. The letter further states that on July 20, 2005, as a condition of his supervised release, he was seen at AtlantiCare Behavioral Health for an evaluation related to his gambling behavior. At that time, the treatment provider did not recommend formal treatment and also did not believe that his employment in a casino would be problematic.

Mr. Stillwill was employed as a front desk manager for Tropicana Casino and Resort from July 2004 through April 2008.

Although Mr. Stillwill has not practiced pharmacy since February of 1999, he has continued to take the continuing education credits required for practicing pharmacists, including over 150 credits hours.

George Stillwill, RP, being desirous of resolving this matter without the necessity of further formal proceedings, and agreeing to waive any right to same, and the Board having determined that, given the period of time Mr. Stillwill has been out of practice and the issues which caused the revocation of his license, this Order is sufficiently protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and all parties agreeing to the terms of this Order;

IT IS therefore on this 3 day of APRIL, 2009,

ORDERED THAT:

1. The license of Mr. George Stillwill shall be reinstated following his provision of the following documents to the Executive Director of the Board, which shall all be to the satisfaction of the Board:

- a. Documentation of successful completion of the Multi-state Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination (MPJE) with a score of 75 or better.

- b. Proof of successful completion of all application requirements including a Criminal History Background Check negative for any actions not mentioned above and payment of all reinstatement fees.

2. After Mr. Stillwill has complied with all the requirements of paragraph one of this Order to the satisfaction of the Board, his license to practice pharmacy shall be reinstated subject to the conditions in paragraphs three through seven of this Order.

3. Mr. Stillwill shall successfully complete a six month period of supervised practice immediately upon his employment in a pharmacy following the reinstatement of his license. During this period Mr. Stillwill shall be directly supervised at all professional settings by a supervisor pre-approved by the Board. Prior to beginning any employment, Mr. Stillwill shall ensure that his supervisor confirms with the Board, in writing, that he/she has seen the consent order of May 2001 and this consent order, agrees to supervise Mr. Stillwill, and agrees to advise the Board within 24 hours of any awareness of any violation by Mr. Stillwill of any statute or regulation governing the practice of pharmacy or of any violation of this consent order. At the end of the supervised period, Mr. Stillwill shall ensure that his supervisor confirms with the Board, in writing, that he/she has

supervised Mr. Stillwill for the entire six month period and recommends unconditionally and without reservation that Mr. Stillwill is able to practice pharmacy without supervision.

4. Mr. Stillwill shall comply with all statutes, regulations and professional standards applicable to the practice of pharmacy.

5. For a two year period following reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy, Mr. Stillwill shall not act as a preceptor or a pharmacist-in-charge (RPIC) at any pharmacy and shall not own or have an ownership interest in any pharmacy.

6. For a two year period following reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy, Mr. Stillwill shall provide a copy of this Order to all employers where a pharmacy license is required for employment or where Mr. Stillwill has access to medication, prescriptions or patient profiles. Mr. Stillwill shall ensure that each employer notifies the Board in writing that he or she has received this Order prior to Mr. Stillwill beginning employment. Mr. Stillwill shall inform the Board in writing of any employment changes, including periods of unemployment, and shall also provide a detailed description of his job, role and responsibilities.

7. In the event that Mr. Stillwill seeks to practice without supervision or amend the terms of this Order at any time in the future, then this Order shall require him to appear before a committee of the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy.
