This matter was initially opened to the New Jersey State Board of Accountancy (Board) upon receipt of information that on February 7, 1997, Dong Jin Park, (Respondent) was committed to the Ann Klein Forensic Psychiatric Hospital, Trenton, NJ, after it was determined that Respondent suffered from a mental illness and posed a danger to himself and others. By Final Order dated May 27, 1997, the Board suspended Respondent's license until he could provide the Board with proof that he is competent to resume the practice of public accountancy in New Jersey. As way of background, Respondent killed his wife on December 23, 1993. Respondent was later found not guilty by reason of insanity and was confined to the Ann Klein Forensic Hospital and thereafter to Greystone Park Psychiatric

Hospital, Parsippany, New Jersey. Respondent was discharged from Greystone Park Psychiatric on or about October 20, 2004, and then entered a program at Friendship House, Hackensack, New Jersey and was subsequently discharged on January 27, 2009.

Respondent first requested reinstatement of his CPA license on or about December 4, 2004. Respondent appeared before a Committee of the Board on March 8, 2005. Thereafter, the Board determined to defer consideration of reinstatement for three years during which time Respondent must obtain a minimum of one year of accounting experience under a New Jersey licensed CPA, comply with all continuing professional education requirements, provide the Board with blood test results confirming medication requirements are met, have quarterly evaluations from Respondent's treating psychiatrist sent directly to the Board to document whether Respondent is compliant with his therapy, and have quarterly reports from his employer sent directly to the Board to confirm the experience requirement.

Thereafter, Respondent made a second request to reinstate his license on or about September 1, 2009. Respondent submitted documents to the Board verifying that he completed more than 120 continuing professional education credits; satisfied a minimum of one year of accounting experience under a New Jersey licensed CPA; and correspondence from his current treating psychiatrist at Bergen Regional Medical Center, Paramus, New Jersey, stating that Mr. Park remains compliant with his treatment and monthly evaluations, is clinically stable, and is capable of resuming his occupational activities. Furthermore, the Board has received Respondent's blood

test results confirming he is adhering to medication requirements and the Board has received quarterly evaluations from Respondent's treating psychiatrist confirming he is compliant with treatment. Respondent appeared before a Committee of the Board on January 14, 2010 to discuss his intentions on practicing as a CPA in the State of New Jersey. Respondent testified as to his previous psychiatric hospital confinements, medication management and current psychiatric therapy, along with other issues. The Board after reviewing all of Mr. Park's documentation and testimony, found Mr. Park to be competent to practice public accountancy in New Jersey and that the public welfare would be sufficiently protected if Respondent's license is reinstated subject to certain conditions.

THEREFORE, IT IS ON THIS 17th DAY OF JUNE 2010,

ORDERED AND AGREED:

1. Dong Jin Park's license to practice accountancy in the State of New Jersey is reinstated upon the entry of this Order.
2. Dong Jin Park shall ensure that his present and any successor treating psychiatrist shall submit quarterly reports to the Board stating whether Mr. Park remains clinically stable, compliant with medication and therapy requirements, for a minimum of two years. Mr. Park's treating psychiatrist shall immediately (within 24 hours) report to the Board orally and in writing of any non-compliance by Mr. Park regarding the above requirements including his release or termination of therapy.


3. Mr. Park may apply for modification of the conditions set forth above no earlier than two years after entry of this Consent Order.

4. Respondent hereby consents to the entry of an Order of automatic suspension of license without notice, upon the Board's receipt of any information which the Board in its sole discretion deems reliable that Respondent has failed to comply with any provision of this Order. Respondent shall have the right to apply for removal of the automatic suspension on five (5) days notice.

5. Respondent expressly waives any claim to privilege or confidentiality that he may have concerning reports and disclosures to the Board, and use by the Board of that information in any license proceeding.


