This matter was opened to the Board of Pharmacy (hereinafter "the Board") upon submission of an application for registration as a pharmacy technician by Lisa Veltri (hereinafter "Respondent"). The application has been reviewed and the following findings of fact and conclusions of law are made:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about September 30, 2009, Respondent completed a New Jersey application for registration as a pharmacy technician.
2. By way of written statement provided to her employer, CVS Pharmacy, on October 29, 2009, Respondent admitted to diverting controlled dangerous substances from the CVS Pharmacy, where she was training to become a pharmacy technician.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The above findings of fact provide grounds for denying Respondent's application for registration as a pharmacy technician,

pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b)&(e) and N.J.A.C. 13:39-6.6, in that Respondent has engaged in the use of dishonesty, fraud, deception, misrepresentation, false promise or false pretense and has engaged in professional or occupational misconduct.

DISCUSSION

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, a Provisional Order of Denial of Initial Registration was entered by this Board on March 1, 2010, which provisionally denied the Respondent's application to register as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey. The Provisional Order of Denial of Initial Registration clearly stated that it was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry unless Respondent requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting Respondent's request for consideration and reasons therefor. Respondent has failed to submit a response to the POD. Because the POD was forwarded to Respondent's address of record, and because the regular mail was not returned as undeliverable, and the certified mail was delivered and signed for, the Board deems service to have been effected. Accordingly, it is determined that further proceedings are not necessary and that the

Provisional Order should be made final.

IT IS, THEREFORE, on this 9th day of JUNE 2010,

ORDERED that:

1. Respondent's application for registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey is denied.
