: CONSENT ORDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy upon receipt of information that Christopher D. Hausser ("Respondent") had entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Connecticut Board of Pharmacy in September of 2009 whereby his license to practice pharmacy in Connecticut was placed on probationary status for five years. Among other things, Respondent agreed not to consume alcohol or any controlled substance unless prescribed by a duly licensed medical practitioner. Respondent further agreed to participate in a treatment program for substance abuse, including alcohol abuse.

Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in New Jersey expired on April 30, 2009. Respondent's failure to submit his biennial renewal in New Jersey in 2009 has resulted in a lapsed status and the automatic suspension of Respondent's license to practice as a pharmacist in the State of New Jersey without a hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b).

The parties having agreed to the resolution of this matter without further formal proceedings, and the Respondent having agreed and given his voluntary consent to the within order and waiving any right to a hearing in this matter, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public's health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 12 day of July, 2010,

ORDERED AND AGREED:

1. Respondent shall not reapply for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey until he has obtained an unrestricted to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut.

2. Prior to Board consideration of an application for reinstatement of his license, Respondent shall:

a. Appear before the Board or a committee thereof to discuss his readiness to re-enter the practice of pharmacy. At that time, Respondent shall be prepared to affirmatively

establish his fitness, competence, and capacity to re-enter the active practice of pharmacy, discuss the circumstances underlying his settlement with the Connecticut Board of Pharmacy and propose his plans for future practice in New Jersey.

b. Provide the Board with evidence that he is capable of discharging the functions of a licensee in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety, and welfare and that he is not then suffering from any impairment or limitation resulting from the use of any addictive substance which could affect his practice.

c. Provide the Board with proof of successful completion of all application requirements including a Criminal History Background Check with results satisfactory to the Board, and payment of all reinstatement fees.

d. Provide the Board with proof of successful completion of all terms contained in the Connecticut Settlement Agreement and proof that he holds an unrestricted license to practice pharmacy in the State of Connecticut.

3. Respondent shall inform the Board in writing of any changes regarding his settlement agreement with the Connecticut Board.

4. Respondent shall comply with all statutes, regulations, and professional standards applicable to the practice of pharmacy.
