CONSENT ORDER  
OF  
VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") upon receipt of a letter dated April 27, 2010 from the Professional Assistance Program ("PAP") requesting that the Board modify the Consent Order filed on July 28, 2009 in the matter of Paul Zamerowski, R.Ph. ("Respondent"). Among other things, pursuant to the 2009 Consent Order, Respondent agreed to participate in random urine monitoring under the supervision of the PAP on an unannounced basis, but no less than twice per week. Due to the Respondent's financial difficulties, PAP has requested that the Board consider a reduction in Respondent's urine screens

from twice per week to once per week with the express understanding that Respondent will undergo twice weekly urine screening for a minimum of two years prior to any application Respondent to return to the practice of pharmacy.

The Board having reviewed PAP's request on behalf of Respondent, the parties having agreed to the resolution of this matter without further formal proceedings, and the Respondent having agreed and given his voluntary consent to the within order and waiving any right to a hearing in this matter, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public's health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

IT IS, therefore on this 10<sup>th</sup> day of NOVEMBER, 2010

**ORDERED THAT:**

1. All the terms of the Consent Order filed on July 28, 2009 remain in effect, except that:
  - a. Respondent shall undergo random urine monitoring under the supervision of the PAP on an unannounced basis, at a frequency to be determined by the PAP, but no less than once per week.
  - b. For two years immediately prior to any application by Respondent seeking reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey, he shall undergo random urine monitoring a minimum of twice per week under the

supervision of the PAP on an unannounced basis.
