**CONSENT ORDER**

This matter was reopened to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter the "Board") upon the August 24, 2010, petition of Louis E. Baxter, M.D., Executive Medical Director of the Professional Assistance Program of New Jersey ("PAP"), on behalf of Dr. Keith P. Radbill, D.O. ("Dr. Radbill") to reduce the frequency of Dr. Radbill's random urine screens and to increase his practice hours.

By way of procedural history, Dr. Radbill was initially permitted to participate in the Alternate Resolution Program ("ARP") of PAP and have his identity protected. However, he was reported by

name to the Board as a result of his non-compliance with his enrollment terms entered on June 17, 2003 and modified on September 18, 2006. Specifically, Dr. Radbill acknowledged that he had used professional samples of Tramadol to self-medicate, though he was required to remain abstinent from all psychoactive substances under his agreement with the ARP absent a bona fide prescription. Dr. Radbill subsequently entered a Consent Order with the Board on February 10, 2009.

The Board is satisfied that Dr. Radbill has complied with all terms and conditions imposed upon his practice of medicine by the February 10, 2009 Consent Order. Accordingly, the Board concludes that good cause exists to modify its prior Order.

Dr. Radbill, agreeing to the modification, and the Board finding the within disposition to be adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare and for other good cause shown, and all parties agreeing to the terms of this Order;

IT IS on this 10 day of February 2011,

ORDERED:

1. Keith P. Radbill, D.O., shall remain enrolled in the Professional Assistance Program ("P.A.P.") at his own expense.

2. The terms of Dr. Radbill's previous enrollment in A.R.P. shall continue to be carried forward into his enrollment in P.A.P. with modifications as follows:

- a. Dr. Radbill shall maintain absolute abstinence from all psychoactive substances, including alcohol, unless prescribed by a treating physician for a documented medical condition with notification from his treating physician to the PAP of the diagnosis and prescribed medications.
- b. Dr. Radbill shall be subject to one random, weekly urine screen until he has attained two years of documented recovery, unless modified by subsequent order of the Board in consultation with PAP. Thereafter, Dr. Radbill will receive random urine screens at a frequency that is consistent with the duration of his recovery as determined by PAP.
- c. Dr. Radbill shall meet in-person with a clinical representative of PAP at a frequency consistent with the duration of his enrollment in PAP. Dr. Radbill shall be allowed to continue to be treated and monitored by his current PAP representative.
- d. Status reports from the PAP shall be made to the Board and the Impairment Review Committee ("IRC") of the Board on a regular basis with immediate notification of any evidence whatsoever of non-compliance or relapse.


3. Dr. Radbill shall continue to comply with all other recommendations set forth by PAP. Dr. Radbill shall continue to remain solely responsible for all costs associated with his enrollment in, and compliance with, PAP.

4. The Board and the Attorney General shall continue to have complete access to the results of any evaluation or testing that Dr. Radbill may undergo as the result of his participation in PAP. The Board and the Attorney General may continue to communicate directly with PAP regarding Dr. Radbill's participation in PAP, and the Board and the Attorney General may continue to specifically request and receive information regarding Dr. Radbill's compliance with any recommendation of PAP.

5. Dr. Radbill shall be limited to engaging in the practice of medicine for a maximum of forty (40) hours per calendar week, unless modified by subsequent order of the Board. Dr. Radbill shall advise all employers of this restriction, without prejudice to any other disclosures required as a condition of employment.

6. Any violation of this Consent Order by Dr. Radbill will result in disciplinary actions by the Board, including suspension or revocation of Dr. Radbill's license and such other sanctions as the Board deems appropriate.
